Do You *Need* Dental Insurance?

Once of the most common concerns our patients have about proceeding with care is, “I don’t have dental insurance.” Fortunately, today we have other options that also often are a better fit for many of our patients.

It's worth looking further into if you are considering any major dental work or a new preventative program for your dental health.. Should you go out and get insurance? Or are you better off paying cash? Now, we have a popular 3rd option - Membership Plans, such as the Pinecrest Smile Club. Today we offer 5 different membership plans, depending on the health needs, age range, and wants of our patients. We launched our first membership plan back in 2013 to fill a growing need. Nearly 40% of Americans are without dental insurance.

One important point for you to be certain of: at Pinecrest Dental, we never make recommendations based on whether or not you have insurance. ***We make recommendations based on your health needs, and let you decide which option suits you best.*** The best care possible costs less today, than it will tomorrow – with or without insurance benefits.

Here is a comparison chart to help you make a decision for your plan:

Dental Insurance Cons

- Individual plans (non-employer) typically have the least amount of benefits
- You are limited by the options dictated by your plan, giving you less choices. Most plans want you to see a dentist they choose, not one you choose.
- Dental insurance isn't really insurance. Once you reach your annual maximum (usually \$1000-\$2000), you have \$0 benefits until the next plan year, even if you meet your deductible. Plus a monthly premium.
- Many sedation, implant, & orthodontic (adults), services are not covered.
- Your insurance company has no interest in your health, well being or satisfaction.
- More and more plans have downgraded, restricted or non-covered services. Waiting periods may apply as well.

Dental Insurance Pros

- Most preventative and basic services are covered, such as evaluations, X-rays and professional cleanings.
- Plans may be subsidized by an employer, giving you "group" power.
- Your out of pocket costs may be reduced by the prepaid benefits included in your plan.
- PPO plans let you use your benefits with any dentist you choose.

Pinecrest Smile Club Cons

- No prepaid benefits. Most visits have a copay.
- Benefits exclusive to Pinecrest Dental and our partners, can't use it at specialists. (However we do have benefits for our members that selected specialists offer)

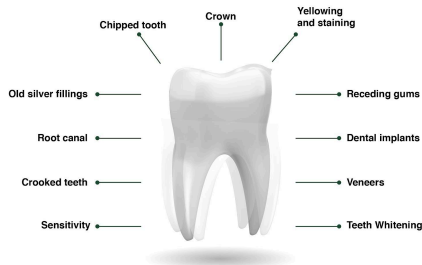
